Government Bill #11

Establish a Special Committee on Mobile N-Card Credentials

Senate Bill #7

Husker Pantry Inclusion Fund

Authored by Speaker of the Senate Madie Beasley

This bill is to buy more inclusive resources for Huskers, as Husker Pantry's current personal items do not necessarily apply to all Huskers' needs.

This bill asks for \$600 on 350 products to buy for Husker Pantry.

Government Bill #12

Establishing An Ad Hoc Committee on Food Access and Support.

This bill recognizes the current food insecurity due to the suspension of SNAP Benefits in which ASUN commits itself to fostering a campus environment in which every student has the support, resources, and opportunities needed to succeed in all ways.

Senator Richards expressed support for the bill.

Speaker Beasley closed on the bill.

Passed by a Voice Vote.

Senator Beasley motioned to bring emergency status legislation to the floor.
